On Dec 29, 2022, an inspection of the above facility found the following violation(s):

1. Description: FAILURE OR SIGNIFICANT INTERRUPTION IN KEY WATER TREATMENT PROCESSES
Citation: 25 PA Code, §109.4(2)
2. Description: FAILURE TO PROVIDE NOTIFICATION TO DEP WITHIN 1-HOUR OF DETERMINING THAT AN IMMINENT THREAT SITUATION EXISTS
Citation: 25 PA Code, §109.701(a)(3)
3. Description: FAILURE TO PROVIDE TIER 1 PUBLIC NOTICE WITHIN 24 HRS. OF DETERMINING THAT AN IMMINENT THREAT EXISTS.
Citation: 25 PA Code, §109.408
4. Description: OTHER VIOLATIONS DEEMED TO BE SIGNIFICANT DEFICIENCIES
Citation: 25 PA Code, §109.4

The Department has determined that these violation(s) meet the definition of a significant deficiency or are contributing to a significant deficiency as described in Title 25 Pa. Code Section 109.1 of the Department's regulations. Regulatory requirements for responding to a significant deficiency are contained in Title 25 Pa. Code Chapter 109.

In addition to the significant deficiencies identified above, the following violation(s) were also identified:

1. Description: FAILURE TO OPERATE AND MAINTAIN THE WATER SYSTEM

Citation: 25 PA Code, §109.4

In order to comply with Title 25 Pa. Code Chapter 109, it is recommended you:

- By Jan 28, 2023: Consult with the Department regarding the appropriate corrective action.
- By Feb 12, 2023: Respond in writing to significant deficiencies, indicating how and on what schedule the system will address significant deficiencies.
- By Apr 28, 2023: Correct all significant deficiencies.
- Notify the Department that a significant deficiency has been corrected within 30 days of completion of the corrective action.

Any violation of Title 25 Pa. Code 109 could result in further enforcement action, including civil and criminal penalties. Each day the violation continues constitutes a separate offense.

This Notice of Violation is neither an order nor any other final action of the Department of Environmental Protection. It neither imposes nor waives any enforcement action available to the Department under any of its statutes. If the Department determines that an enforcement action is appropriate, you will be notified of the action.
