- On November 9, 2022, you, by your servants, agents or employees, sold, furnished and/or gave or permitted such sale, furnishing or giving of alcoholic beverages to one (1) minor, twenty (20) years of age.

These charges will be brought before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) who has the authority to impose penalties ranging from \$50-\$1,000 for minor offenses and up to \$5,000 for more serious offenses. In addition, the ALJ can also impose a license suspension or revocation of the license based on the severity of the charge brought. The ALJ can also mandate training for the licensee in an effort to educate them on the requirements of being a licensee.
